Camp Gove Near Falmouth  
Dear Parents & Sister

I have just received  
the 1<sup>st</sup> letter since the one you  
sent the receipt (No 78) this  
one is 25<sup>cts</sup> & Stamp in it  
I am sorry mother is sick  
but am glad she is better  
I hope she will continue  
to get better

That devilish Box is in the  
Convalescent Camp & cannot  
be got out. The men there used  
to steal stuff so there that  
they had to issue an order  
forbidding any boxes going  
out of that camp.

I have sent to Kingman  
to have him open the

Box & send Tobacco & all  
stuff by mail that he can  
to me I never want another  
Box sent even if I send  
for one. We hear that this  
Regt<sup>l</sup> is coming home to  
recruit. I hope it is so  
but dont put much de-  
pendence in the report  
Still we may. We shall not  
lay here much longer I dont  
think

My clothing account last  
year was this

This s. 14 I shall get the  
1<sup>st</sup> time I am paid which  
will not be until the 1<sup>st</sup>  
of May. I may get some  
this coming pay day but  
dont expect it as I was  
not mustered here but was  
reported sick in hospital  
Uncle Daniel was never in  
any Battle or fight of any  
description

I shall have over \$112. coming  
to me the 1<sup>st</sup> of May

I may send you your picture  
if you send one of the ~~me~~  
who - you can spell the  
rest I cannot

We have just come in from  
4 days picket this noon  
& am tired enough

Hawkes is well & hearty  
I must stop for this

time to send this by mail  
hoping you will be better  
when I hear again from  
you remain
