

Camp Parole March 10th/64

Dear Parents & Sister

I received your letter
with the money all right
last night. It was as much
as I wanted if I come. We
have not heard from our furloughs
but I think we shall get them
certain. The Post Adjutant
told one of us yesterday that we
should have them immediately
We can get transportation from
Baltimore certain & most
of the men get it from here
It only costs 1.50 from here to
Baltimore All the trouble
about our having furloughs
is, that is possible there may
be an exchange, but it is

not at all probable there
will be any at present
The Truce Boat brought
down 600 men from the
Island at Richmond yesterday
There is nothing new to write
about

That man I wrote you about
(Patten) was examined and
opened but there was nothing
about him or in his stomach
that would cause his death

The Doctors brought in
that his death came from
natural causes. His watch
pocket that he carried his
money in, was cut out
Doctors dont know everything
now a days

There is a lot of troops coming
here to (rendervous) is that
spelt right) for an expedition

under Burnside. The

56th Mass is coming for
one I am well & hope
this will find you the same
Is Fathers hand any better
Did you get a Harpers
from me with EW Greens
picture in it
But I must stop
Hoping to hear from you
