June 12th 1864

Dear Parents & Sister

Another Sunday & allright

yet, I am company clerk now

but dont get rid of any duty

by it. I have to keep a memorandum

of everything that is

going on & if we ever get in

camp again it will have to

be put on Company Books

We are laying quiet in the

breastworks? There is no fighting

going on except shelling

once in a while.

I want you should send me

a dollar or so when you

write. I shall not get any

pay till after I am

mustered the last of

this month. I shall be

mustered for all back

pay (10 months) & will not

get it till last of July

or 1st of August.

Don't forget to send me

some writing paper & envelopes

& stamps for we dont

get them here now. There

is no sutlers. We can buy

tobacco & ham & sugar

of the commissary

But I must stop
