Morrisville Va May 31. 1863

Dear Parents & Sister

Well we have moved at last up here. There is only the 1st Division stretched along for 25 miles. You will see by this map where we are. You will see where we went to Chancellorsville across Kelly's Ford by the line I have marked. The line I have dotted is the way we have come this last time.

I am well as common.

Solon Walton is orderly Sergeant next to 2^d Lieut.

Frank Hayden has not come back yet. I can come home on a 5 days furlough & have 3 nights & 2 days at home & come for 8 & back for 8 ^{dollars} more. That is if

any ~~more~~ ^{very} one is sick at home
We must have a good excuse
for coming.

If you should write that there
is any sick you should write
so I can show it to the Officer

Do you understand

You must not worry if you
dont hear from me regular
for we cannot send letters very
regular but mail will come
to us regular by the supply
trains

The story is that the Subs are
going to move on Washington
& I suppose we are watching
them I dont think of much
to write. I got paper with
Tobacco & letter the next day
all right I cannot send the
measure of the stripes now all
you will have to get will be

The Green stuff I will
send cloth to ^{sell} sow it on
when I have a chance. Pam in
no hurry for them

I don't know when we shall
be paid off now, but soon I
guess. The 3rd Battery signed
the pay roll before we started
so the Paymaster is round
somewhere
